
#### **UKCA Mark**

#### What is the UKCA Mark?

The UKCA (UK Conformity Assessed) marking is a new UK product marking used for goods being placed on the market in Great Britain (England, Wales and Scotland). It covers most goods which previously required the CE marking.






#### What does a UKCA Mark show?

By affixing a UKCA mark to a product and placing it onto the GB market, the manufacturer is stating that the product meets the UK Regulations.

#### When does the UKCA Mark come into force?

The UKCA mark will be used to replace the CE Marking requirements for products being placed on the GB market from the 1st January 2021. For most products there is a transitional arrangement for acceptance of CE marking until 31st December 2024 following the announcement of an extension.
